

## **MDS 3.0 Transition Information for AANAC Learners**

### **April 23, 2010**

CMS has published all the chapters of the new MDS 3.0 RAI Manual and held the Train-the Trainer workshop in April in Baltimore. AANAC experts have completed their writing, reviews, and edits of our MDS 3.0 Certification program. We are rolling out this program online on May 3, 2010. Watch for notice on the AANAC homepage that the MDS 3.0 Certification is available online.

**The information provided by AANAC is subject to revision based on future updates and clarifications by CMS, AANAC will provide continuous updates.**

#### **Overview of the AANAC MDS 3.0 Certification Program:**

#### **Group 1: If you are certifying for the first time or your MDS 2.0**

##### **Certification through AANAC expired prior to 12/31/06,** AANAC's MDS 3.0

Certification will be comprised of a total of 10 courses (seven core/three electives) to be taken and passed with a score of 80% or higher. The MDS 3.0 Certification courses will be offered in the following formats: online, hardbound manual, and workshop. Group 1 students will be required to take the following seven core courses: Coding, OBRA, PPS, RUGs IV, Care Area Assessments (replaces the RAPs), Introduction to Medicare Part A(replaces Billing), and Care Planning. In addition, learners will be required to select three electives from a list of electives to meet the certification requirements. AANAC may provide an updates course based on future updates from CMS offered only online, to complete your certification. This will ensure that you have the most accurate and up to date information provided by CMS on the MDS 3.0. #### **Group 2: If your MDS 2.0 Certification is current or expired after 12/31/06,**

the requirement for MDS 3.0 Certification for individuals in this group is to take and pass a total of five courses with a score of 80% or higher. These courses will be offered in online, hardbound manual, and workshop formats. The five required MDS 3.0 Certification Courses for this group are: Coding, OBRA, PPS, RUGs IV and Care Area Assessments (replaces the RAPs). You will not be required to take electives in order to certify for MDS 3.0. AANAC, may provide an updates course based on future updates from CMS, offered only online, to complete your certification. This will ensure that you have the most accurate and up to date information provided by CMS on the MDS 3.0. We will keep you updated through the website and with email blasts as MDS 3.0 courses are online and ready for you to take. AANAC hardcopy manuals will be available later in May.

Both AANAC and Training Partner workshops will be available starting at the end of April at the AANAC National Conference in Las Vegas and through Training Partners throughout the country starting in May. Please check our website, AANAC.org for times and dates. The workshops will be structured to accommodate the requirements for MDS 3.0 Certification in both of the groups discussed above: the five courses required for Group 2 will be offered during the first two days of the three-day workshop. Therefore, individuals in that group will be required to take only the first two days of the workshop.

Individuals in Group 1 will be required to take the entire three-day workshop to complete the 10 required courses.

Online courses and workshops will stay at the same affordable prices until January 1, 2011. Each online course is \$35. For Group 2 learners, we are waiving the \$35 recertification fee. On January 1, the price for online courses will increase to \$45 per course.

Workshop prices will also stay the same at \$450 for AANAC members and \$650 for non-members for a full three-day RAC-CT workshop until January 1, 2011. For Group 2, attending two days of the workshop will cost \$350 for members and \$550 for non-members until January 1, 2011. On January 1, 2011, the workshop price will increase to \$549 for members and \$899 for non-members for 3 days and \$399 for members and \$699 for non-members for 2 days. We strongly encourage you to take advantage of the low prices during 2010 to be ready for implementation of the MDS 3.0. We have not increased our prices for many years, however, with the most significant investment in ten years rewriting all of our courses, we have found it necessary to increase prices to cover our costs. In addition, costs at workshop venues such as hotels are also increasing each year. Out of courtesy to our members, our pricing will remain the same through December 31, 2010. Therefore, I encourage you to obtain your Certification in 2010 in order to realize savings as well as to maintain your professional status as a RAC-CT.
